

SITUATION REPORT (SITREP)

Daloy Care Emergency Response and Rehabilitation Support

Location: Sapu Padidu, Malapatan, Sarangani Province

Implementing Organization: Daloy Care Organization Inc.

Current Phase: Coordination, Beneficiary Identification, and Response Preparation

1. Situation Overview

Daloy Care Organization, Inc. is currently conducting field coordination and community preparation activities as part of its Emergency Response and Rehabilitation Support. The field team is working closely with the concerned Local Government Units (LGUs), barangay officials, community leaders, and affected families to ensure that assistance is appropriately targeted and reaches those most in need. The current response preparation focuses on affected families in both **evacuation centers** and **remote/upland communities**, including households that may face challenges in accessing humanitarian assistance due to geographical and logistical barriers.

2. Key Activities Completed/Ongoing

Coordination with LGUs, Barangays, and Communities



- Conducting coordination meetings with concerned LGUs and barangay officials
- Engaging community leaders and representatives to validate priority needs
- Confirming affected communities and appropriate locations for intervention
- Coordinating access, mobilization, transportation, and activity schedules; and
- Coordinating with local stakeholders to minimize duplication of assistance.

Participant and Beneficiary Identification



- Identifying affected families currently staying in evacuation centers
- Identifying vulnerable households in remote and upland communities
- Preparing and validating preliminary beneficiary lists
- Prioritizing families with children and other vulnerable individuals
- Identifying participants for psychosocial support activities; and
- Conducting coordination and validation with local authorities and community representatives.

3. Priority Beneficiary Groups

The response prioritizes affected families and individuals, particularly:

- Families in evacuation centers
- Households in remote and upland communities
- Families with children
- Older persons and persons with disabilities;
- Pregnant and lactating women
- Female-headed households
- Families with limited access to food and basic necessities; and
- Households with limited access to other forms of assistance.

4. Planned Response Activities

Following the completion of coordination and beneficiary validation, Daloy Care will proceed with:



- Distribution of emergency relief packs to validated priority families;
- Psychosocial support activities for affected families and participants;
- Community-based engagement and support activities;
- Documentation of key needs and emerging concerns; and
- Identification of families requiring possible follow-up rehabilitation support.

5. Current Status

The field team is actively undertaking coordination, community mobilization, and Participants/beneficiary identification. Preliminary lists of affected families and potential participants are being validated with LGUs, barangay officials, and community representatives. Special attention is being given to ensuring that vulnerable and geographically isolated families are included in the response and are not excluded because of access and logistical challenges.

6. Immediate Next Steps

1. Complete LGU, barangay, and community coordination
2. Finalize and validate beneficiary and participant lists
3. Confirm distribution sites, venues, schedules, and logistical arrangements
4. Complete preparations for relief pack distribution
5. Conduct psychosocial support activities; and
6. Document the response and identify follow-up rehabilitation needs.

Overall-Assessment:

The response is currently progressing through the coordination and beneficiary identification phase. Continued collaboration with LGUs, barangay officials, community leaders, and affected families remains essential to ensure that Daloy Care's emergency assistance is targeted, inclusive, transparent, and responsive to the most urgent needs of affected communities.
